Community and school information

- Mission Statement: Provide students with an individualized educational experience that promotes ownership of their learning while preparing them to be successful, productive, and adaptable in an ever-changing world.
- The Tenney School is located in west Houston. Due to the unique nature of the program, Tenney School serves students from the entire Houston metropolitan area.
- Founded in 1973, The Tenney School has maintained accreditation through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) since 1979. SACS has since merged with other accrediting bodies to form Cognia.



Curriculum

- The Tenney School works with students with diverse academic abilities. Students are placed in courses based on how they perform on the Terra Nova Achievement Test. Students performing below grade level will be placed in courses labeled as Mod (Modified) or ELL (English Language Learner). Students performing above grade level will be in courses labeled H (for Honors).
- The following courses are currently available at the Advanced Placement level:
 - AP English III
 - AP English IV
 - AP Environmental Science
 - AP Calculus
 - AP Statistics
 - AP Human Geography
- Approximately 30% of juniors and seniors are enrolled in one or more AP classes.
- Students at The Tenney School earn their diploma under the Texas Foundations High School Program (FHSP) criteria. Since the adoption of the FHSP, all Tenney School students have earned a diploma under the FHSP with Distinguished Level of Achievement with at least one Endorsement.
